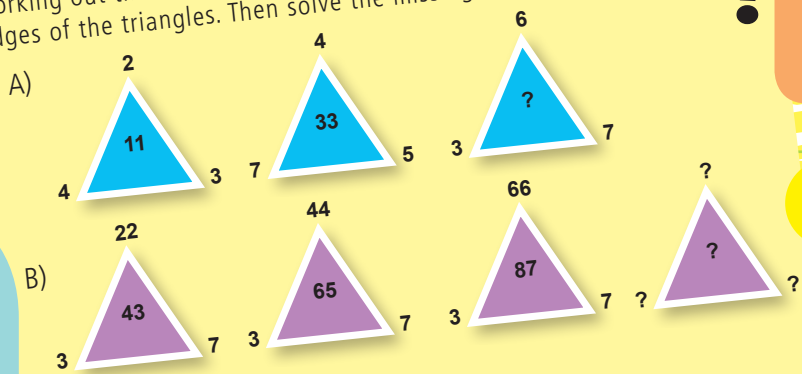


1. Triangle trouble!

Calculate the numbers in the middle of the triangle by working out the connection between the numbers on the edges of the triangles. Then solve the missing numbers.



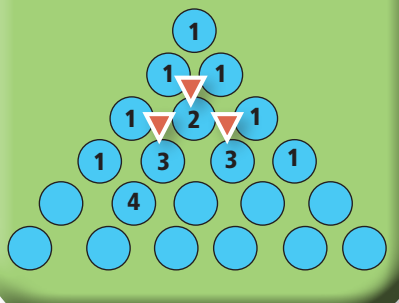
3. Word Sudoku puzzle

2. TRIANGLE PATTERNS

The triangle below is known as Pascal's triangle. The numbers in this sequence work as follows. Look at the little red triangles. Can you see that $1 + 1 = 2$, forming a little triangle? Now you see that $1 + 2 = 3$, again form a triangle. See if you can solve the rest of the triangle.



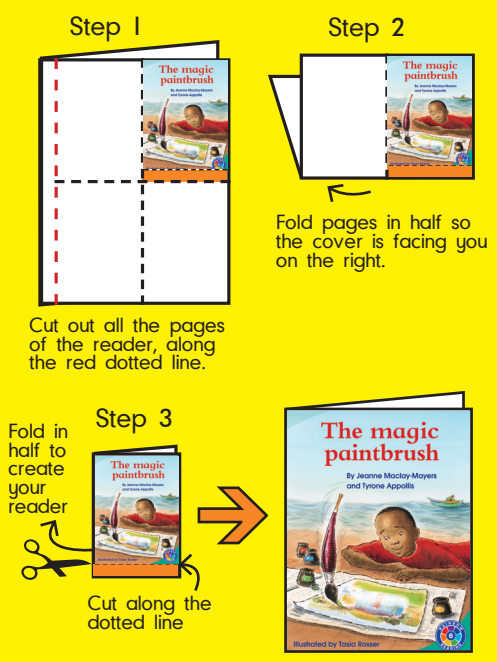

Saving Children with the EVERY ONE campaign



'All children have the right to life'

The United Nations Convention on the rights of the child states that "all children have the right to life".

But, unfortunately, some children do not live long enough to realise their full potential. Diseases, such as tuberculosis, pneumonia and malaria, take the lives of young children, often because their parents do not know enough about how to prevent and treat these diseases.

But we should not lose hope. If we work together as a team, South Africa's young people can make a difference in the lives of children and try to correct the mistakes of the past.

Save the Children recently launched the Newborn and Child Survival Campaign. At a roundtable discussion in a small village in Limpopo we talked about how to make a difference in the lives of children.

During the discussion we talked about what communities, the government and the youth can do to make sure that South Africa's children get the chance to grow up to be healthy adults.

- Here are some of the ideas we got from the children during the discussion:
- We need to speak to the people at the crèches and make sure they know how to care for young children.
 - Save the Children could teach young children how to raise funds for the campaign.
 - Children could become peer educators and encourage other learners to get involved in the campaign.
